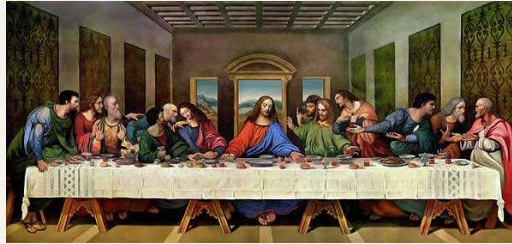




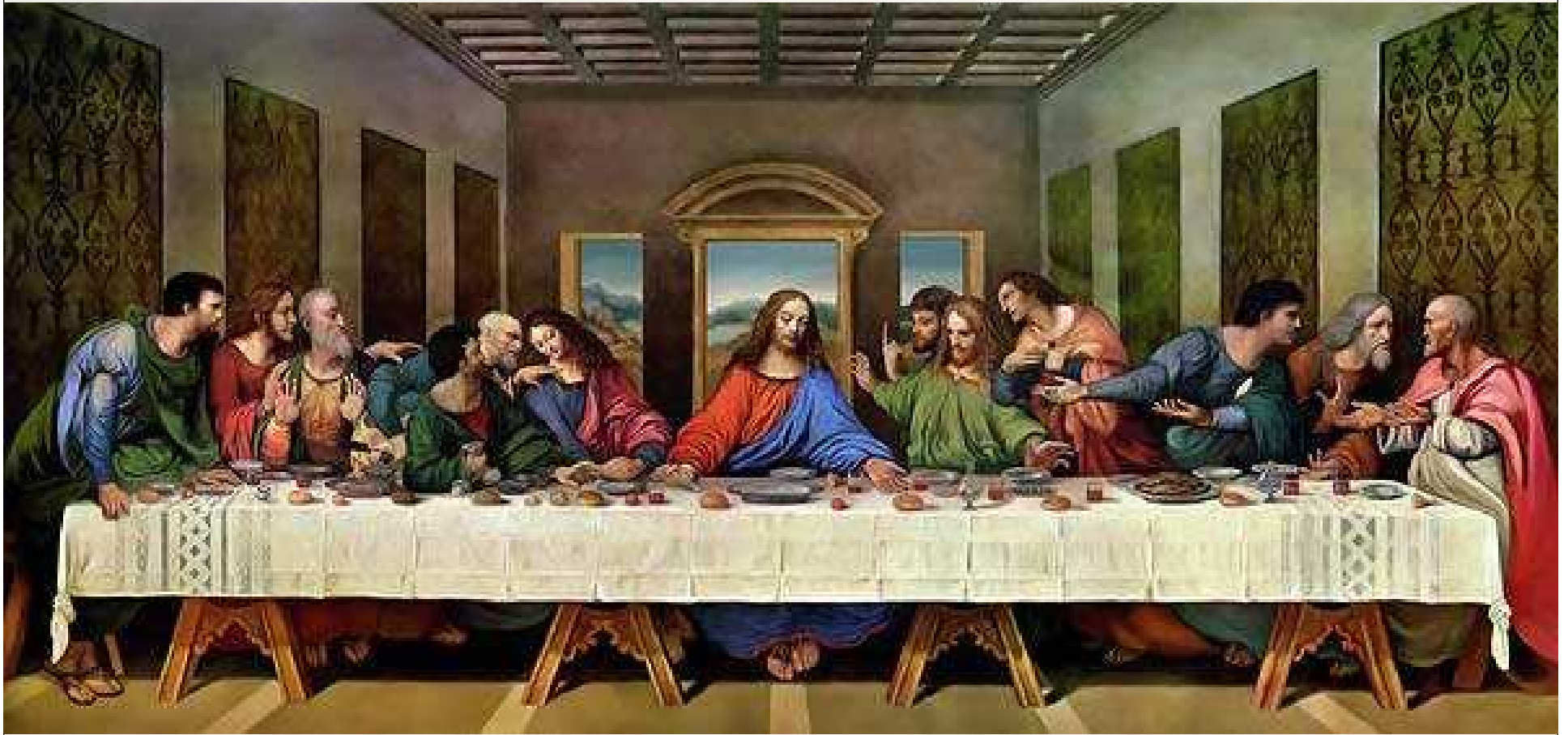
Garden of Gethsemane

7. What signal did Judas give to identify Jesus as the man to be arrested?

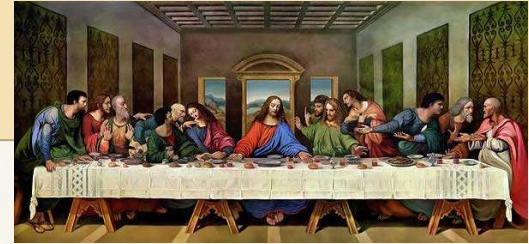


The Last Supper (restored image)

By Leonardo Da Vinci (1452-1519), the famous painting that depicts the last meal Jesus shared with his disciples

The last supper (idiom)

- the final meal Jesus had with his disciples before his death.
- During the supper, Jesus blessed the bread and wine, which represented his body and blood respectively.
- this practice continues to the present-day churches in different names, such as "Holy Communion" in Protestant churches.
- The purpose of this practice is to commemorate Jesus' death and to demonstrate unity among Christians.

Learn words and phrases:

The last supper (idiom)

e.g. The owner of a house on a Scarborough cliff edge has hosted a special dinner as a farewell gesture to the property which is at risk of falling off the cliff as it crumbles. Owner Kane Cunningham invited twelve guests to the bungalow's "**last supper**" to highlight the perils of climate change.

Learn words and phrases:

fall away: withdraw from Jesus' company

²⁷ You will all fall away, Jesus told them, for it is written:

'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered.'

(an idiom using Metaphor)

the followers fall away and are lost without their leadership

31 But Peter insisted emphatically, Even if I have to die

↑ strongly
↓ formally end your connection with someone / deny

the sorrow affected Jesus very strongly

³⁴ My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death, he said to them. Stay here and keep watch.

observe with continuous attention

³⁶ Abba, Father, he said, everything is possible for you.

you will.

Which literary devices are used here?

cup - Jesus' suffering / sacrifice

not what I will, but what you will -
to surrender to the sovereignty of God.

The spirit is willing, but the body is weak.

Literary device: **contrast**

Meaning: When we say someone wants to do something but do not complete it because of physical weakness or other distractions, we say that his "spirit is willing but the flesh is weak". (source: <http://www.selbl.org>)

Learn words and phrases:

⁴³ Just as he was speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, appeared. With him was a crowd armed with swords and clubs, sent from the chief priests, the teachers of the law, and the elders.

Arms are weapons that are used in a war.
Someone who is armed is carrying a weapon.

⁴⁴ Now the betrayer had arranged a signal with them: The one I kiss is the man; arrest him and lead him away under guard.

⁴⁵ Going at once to Jesus, Judas said, Rabbi! and kissed him.

Kiss of death (idiom) (a kiss that causes Jesus to death)
meaning: when something is a kiss of death, it is
considered to have damaging effects

e.g. A political scandal is a kiss of death to politicians.
